

# ACCESS MyCNN

Powered by BASES, My Community Notification Network (MyCNN) is an advanced regional emergency notification tool that provides notifications for emergency and non-emergency updates from local industrial sites, warnings for extreme weather, unexpected road closures, missing persons, and evacuations. These notifications are free of charge and available on [lambtonbases.ca](http://lambtonbases.ca).





# EVACUATION

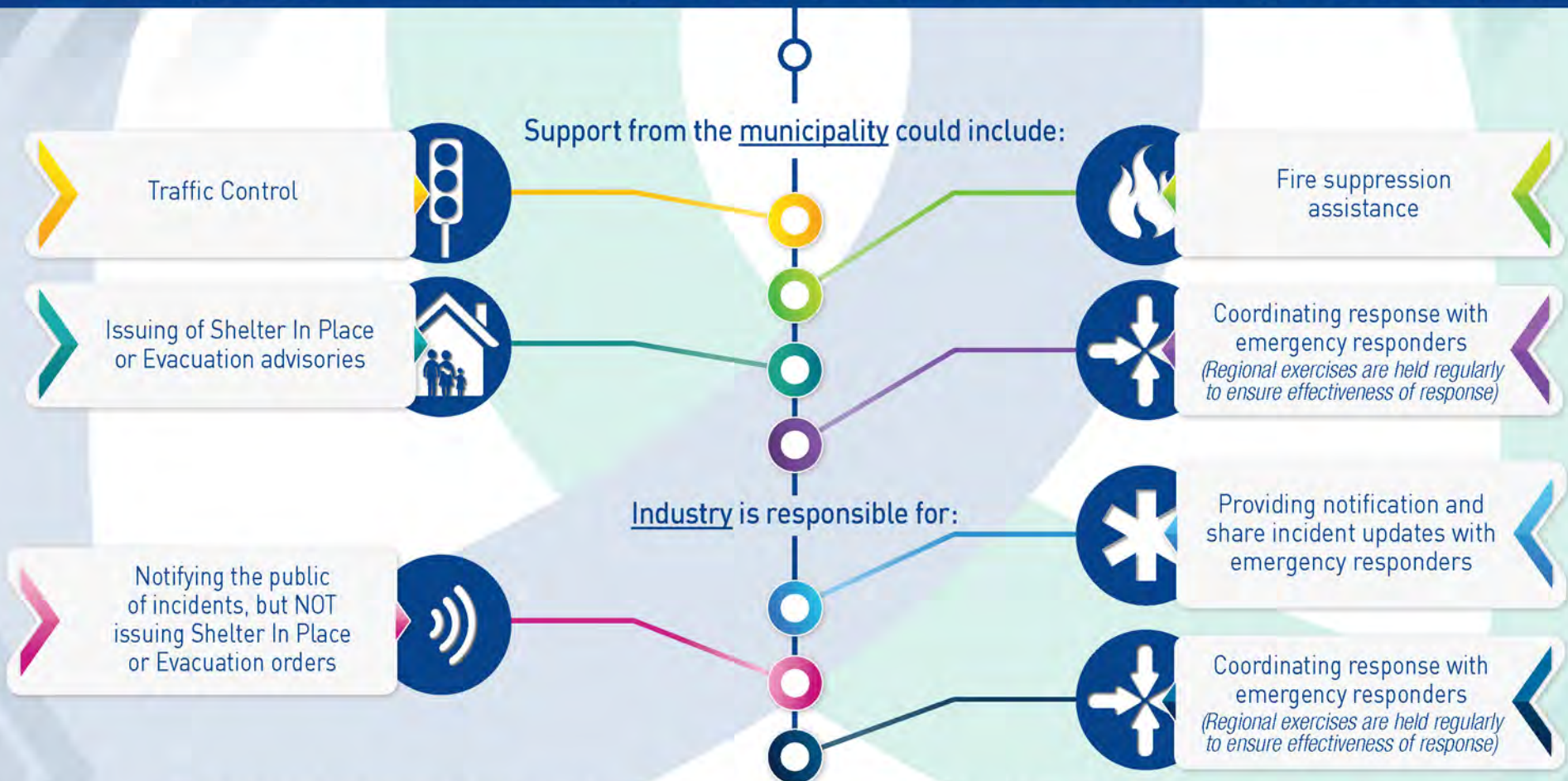
- EVACUATION orders are issued by local government officials during or immediately after an emergency like a chemical spill or natural disaster.
- In some cases, you may have a day or two to prepare, while other emergencies might call for an immediate evacuation.
- If an emergency requires an evacuation municipalities will issue an advisory with further instructions through local media, phone systems, and directly to MyCNN subscribers.





## WHO IS RESPONSIBLE FOR WHAT IN AN EMERGENCY?

- In the event of an INDUSTRIAL EMERGENCY, industry and local government work together closely to respond quickly & effectively.
- Industry and municipal response teams coordinate using regional CAER processes. Response teams may come together through mutual aid processes and unified command may also be established by industrial and municipal response leads as required.

# SHELTER-IN-PLACE

- SHELTER IN PLACE orders are issued by local government officials during or immediately after an emergency, like a chemical spill, or natural disaster.
- If an emergency requires a shelter in place, local municipalities will issue an advisory with further instructions through local media, phone systems, and directly to MyCNN subscribers





# SIRENS

- The Sarnia-Lambton area is home to a sophisticated **Emergency Outdoor Warning Siren System** operated in partnership with local government & the Bluewater Association for Safety, Environment, and Sustainability that are used to warn the public of potential danger
- There are 14 CAER Community Notification Sirens located in Aamjiwnaang First Nation, Point Edward, Sarnia, and St. Clair Township
- Local industry has sirens to alert workers of a site specific incident
- During an emergency, the **sirens may be activated for a set amount of time** as determined by the City of Sarnia or by a specific industry company.
